







330 E Main Street, Dayton: Moose Creek Bakery Building. A small town bakery and cafe straight out of a Hallmark movie set. Moose Creek Bakery has been a favorite amongst tourists and locals. This charming bakery and retail shop has served for years the unoficial gathering spot for locals and the community. Economically, Dayton Washington has been a farming town with a main crop being wheat but more recently vineyards are being planted and wineries are popping nearby. There is a strong part time residential component lending to tourism and nightly rentals outside of the Walla Walla experience. Nestled at the base of the Blue Mountains and founded on the Touchet River, Dayton has become a jumping off point for outdoorsmen, hunters, anglers, skiers, hikers and bikers. This bakery and retail shop has a type one hood and full kitchen, ready for you to take over or bring your concept, the commercial zoning will allow for retail use or restaurant.

RIch in area history, Dayton was a main stop on the Lewis and Clark Expedition with several sites and statues commemorating their visit. It was first settled in the 1850's and soon became a thriving community. Between 1880 and 1910, prosperous businessmen and farmers built impressive residential, commercial and public buildings in the Queen Anne, Italianate, Gothic and Craftsman style of architecture. Today, 117 of those buildings are listed on the Historic register
