Location Overview

The subject property lies within the corporate limits of the city of Grand Isle, in the southern most region of Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, between the Gulf of Mexico and Caminada Bay. Grand Isle is a barrier Island off the main coast of Louisiana approximately 8 miles long and a half mile wide. The climate is semi-tropical with extensive rainy seasons in the summer and winter. Gulf breezes help to cool the island in the summer months. Grand Isle is home to a robust shrimping, fishing and oyster industry. This productivity is a direct result of the Louisiana's vast wetlands and estuaries that are protected by barrier islands like Grand Isle. 95 percent of all Gulf marine life spends at least a portion of its existence in Louisiana. The island also serves as a crucial feeding stop for migrating birds headed north from Latin America in the spring and then back south in the fall and an important habitat many birds, including pelicans, wadingbirds and shorebirds.
